“GET YOU THROUGH” REHEARSAL TIPS

- bring a book, board game or something else you like to do for the times you have to wait
- pack your bathing suit in case you can fit in a quick swim (make sure to ask first!)
- bring a healthy snack and water bottle/drink;
- rest in the shade while waiting
- let one of the core artists know if you have a problem or some questions
- do some scratch art with Sybil when she's there **Sunday, August 3rd (3-5pm) and Thursday August 7th (11-1)**. She will be holding her workshops at the **Ritz**.
- let the stage managers (**Shifra** and **Sasha**) know if you have to leave early, or if you are going to be late or absent. Call **416 834 1485**.
